Tool Shed

The City of Cayce Code Enforcement Team wanted to find a way to assist residents who didn't have the tools needed to keep their yards in compliance. With sponsorship from the Cayce Beautification Foundation, the Community Tool Shed was created. The Code Enforcement Team envisions the Tool Shed as a means to promote community engagement, empower residents and organizations to maintain their neighborhoods, serve as a resource for residents who are in violation of City code(s) to address matters in a timely fashion, and to reduce annual costs of enforcement of overgrown properties and minor structure violations. The Community Tool Shed will allow residents to borrow tools (donated by Lowe's, Martin Marietta, The Graphics Source, and The Carter Insurance Group) for up to 3 days. New Museum Pieces

The Cayce Historical Museum has a collection of items that once belonged to various members of the original Cayce family. One piece, the Starr Piano Company phonograph, was originally produced in Richmond, Indiana. While Starr is considered an "off brand" to companies such as Vitrola, its quality is said to be comparable. This model is from the 1920s and while it shows signs of normal wear, it's considered to be in impeccable condition. It now stands in the Cayce room among other pieces of history once belonging to



the Cayce family. Come and learn more about the Cayce family and their items during the museum's daily hours: Tuesday-Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Grant Enhances Design Efforts

The City of Cayce has received a grant from the Central Carolina Community Foundation to build upon our current planning and design efforts to develop a meaningful and high-quality connection between the Cayce River Arts District and the Cayce Riverwalk. The goal is to improve access physically and visually from the State Street Art Lot to the Riverwalk Trailhead at Lyles Street, which are only a block apart, but are not readily known as so close to each other.
