LEAKS

Water &/or sewer bills are calculated, in part based on consumption (with the exception of some outside of city flat rate sewer areas), so a leak can result in a much higher than normal water bill. Some leaks are easier to find than others, such as a dripping faucet or a running toilet. If you suspect a toilet leak, but do not hear it running, a good way to find out if it has a leak is to place a few drops of food coloring in the tank and wait a few minutes. If the water in the bowl turns color, you have a leak and the flapper probably needs replacing.

WATERING THE LAWN

Watering the lawn is often the number one use of water, especially with an irrigation system. To help conserve water and expenses, the following tips are suggested:

- Water early in the morning (before 10am) to avoid evaporation
- Mow less frequently in dry weather to heights of 1 1/2'-2"
- Leave the clippings or use mulch
- Use a timer and do not over water or water driveways or roads
- Adjust timer for each zone based on sun, shade, and temperature
- In Spring check for damage and/or leaks from broken/frozen pipes
- Check monthly for broken heads or other problems
- Check hoses for poor connections
- Use a sprayer that can be turned off
- Use soaker hoses when applicable

• Use a rain barrel to collect rainwater for irrigation/watering plants An Irrigation Meter that measures water going through the meter for irrigation may lower water bills. However, there are other costs to consider, such as the installation, yearly test of a Testable Backflow Device, the connection of the Irrigation System to the Irrigation Meter, and the additional Water Base Rate charge.

CHANGE IN WATER USE

A higher than normal bill can also be the result of additional guests, filling a swimming pool and/or seasonal demands. The City of Cayce bases residential water use on 1 Residential Equivalent Unit (300 gallons/day). This equates to 18,000 gallons on a bimonthly bill. However, every this is just a guideline. Once again, leaks and irrigation systems can greatly increase the average use.

SANITATION, RECYCLING & YARD TRASH COLLECTIONS



HOUSEHOLD TRASH COLLECTIONS

The City of Cayce provides each of its residents with a roll cart for household garbage. If you move out of town or to another location within the City limits, call the Sanitation Department so we can pick up your cart. It cannot be taken with you when you move. The City maintains ownership of the cart at all times.

Please keep our city clean and litter free by putting garbage in securely tied plastic bags and placing it in the roll cart. Your roll cart should be placed for collection on the morning of pickup - not before, and pulled back in that evening.

RECYCLING

The City of Cayce encourages you to support our Recycling Program. Recycle bins can be purchased at City Hall for \$15.00 each. Please follow these guidelines for recycling:

Acceptable

- Newspaper Newspapers and inserts, newsprint type of papers
- Plastics 1-7 Plastic milk jugs and pop bottles, clear and colored are acceptable, Clorox bottles, ketchup bottles, etc.
- Metal Cans Aluminum and steel cans, any metal or aluminum food can is acceptable
- Magazines, office paper, junk mail
- Telephone books

Not Acceptable

- Mirrors, ceramic cups and plates, clay flower pots, crystal, light bulbs, window glass, heat resistant ovenware, drinking glasses
- Paint cans, pesticide containers, etc.
- Plastic Bags
- Glass Glass food jars, all colors; i.e. soda bottles, beer bottles, juice containers, ketchup bottles, wine and liquor bottles, food containers

YARD TRASH

Bagged yard trash will be given priority over un-bagged yard trash and will be picked up on your regular household trash collection day.

Leaf Bags can be purchased for \$7.00 a piece Black Trash Bag Rolls can be purchased for \$12.00 a roll

Congaree Shelter in the Cayce Riverwalk Park is located at the "T" intersection from the main entrance. The covered pavilion features 2 large picnic tables. Capacity: 10-16 people.

MONTHLY BULK/ WHITE GOODS COLLECTION

Items that are included in the monthly bulk collection are: refrigerators, stoves, water heaters, air conditioners, freezers, washing machines/dryers, and furniture (sofas, chairs, mattresses, box springs, rugs, carpet, dressers, recliners, tables, etc.). If you have any doubt as to whether any item would be considered a "bulk item" call the Sanitation Department at City Hall (803) 205-4434.

The City of Cayce does not pick up electronic scrap. The landfill at 429 Landfill Lane, Lexington SC 29073 will accept this scrap free for residents. Examples of e-scrap are: Printers, CPU's, microwaves, televisions, stereo equipment, fax machines, cell phones, phone systems, circuit boards, components, monitors, etc. For questions regarding e-scrap recycling call 785-3340.

TIRES

A collecting fee will be charged to pick up tires. The cost is \$5.00 per tire. Please call City Hall to arrange to have these items collected. If you have any questions regarding the above information, please call City Hall at 205-4434.

CONSTRUCTION, REMODELING, AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS

The City does not pick up these types of items on a regular basis. Upon special request and payment of required fees in advance of pick up, the City may remove construction debris.

THE CITY OF CAYCE HAS A LEASH LAW



All animals are to be kept either on a leash or in a secured enclosure. Animals seen running loose will be picked up and impounded by an Animal Services Officer. Owners will be required to pay a fine (and may require spay/neuter) before animals will be released.

Any additional charges incurred by maintaining the animal shall be passed on to the owner upon redemption.

Our ordinance and State law require rabies vaccination for all pets.

In addition, anyone walking or owning an animal is required to clean up any waste deposited by the animal on public or private property of anyone other than the property of the animal's owner.

GARAGE SALES

If you're planning a Garage Sale, please note the following guidelines as outlined in the City's Zoning Ordinance relating to garage sales:

- A permit must be obtained from City Hall for each sale and posted at the site of the sale. The cost of each permit is \$8.00 per day for a maximum of six (6) days per permit. The maximum number of permits allowed per year is four (4) per family.
- Off-street parking shall be provided for all persons attending the sale.
- No new or used merchandise shall be purchased or brought in for the sale.
- All merchandise shall be that of the family or families conducting the sale.
- Only one sign may be posted advertising the sale and the sign should be placed on the private property of the person conducting the sale. Hours of the sale shall be from 8:00am to 6:00pm.
- The use of a public address system is prohibited.
- No alcoholic beverages of any type shall be served or given on or near the premises.

If upon inspection by the City Manager or a designee, the inspector or a policeman, finds that in his/her opinion the ordinance is being violated, a citation will be issued or the right to continue with the sale will be terminated at once.

FIREWORKS ORDINANCE

The City of Cayce has a Fireworks ordinance. Fireworks may be discharged within the City only on July 4th from 10:00am until 10:00pm and on December 31st from 10:00am until January 1 at 1:00am.

The following is a list of Cayce's citizen committees. Typically, committees meet once a month at the City Hall Complex.

From time to time, we need citizens to fill partial or full terms. If serving on one of the committees is of interest to you, please feel free to contact Mendy Corder at City Hall, 550-9557. Some committees require that one or more individuals have specific experience, others simply need persons who possess the desire and commitment to serve.

Accommodations Tax: Advises City Council on the expenditure of local accommodations tax funds for the purpose of promoting tourism, the arts and cultural affairs in the community. Members are selected from the hospitality and lodging industries, as well as from the community at large.

Beautification Foundation: Plan, fund, and implement projects to enhance the quality of life for citizens of Cayce, SC.

Events Committee: Works with City staff to plan and coordinate community events that encourage and foster good community relations and citizen participation.

Housing Authority: Works with Columbia Housing Authority officials to adapt State and Federal financial aid programs to our area's housing needs.

Housing and Construction Board of Adjustments and Appeals: Reviews citizen appeals to ensure building ordinances are properly interpreted and implemented fairly.

Museum & Historical Commission: Studies and preserves the history of the area and acquires and exhibits historically significant works.

Municipal Election Commission: Commissioners observe the voting process on Election Day that is handled by Lexington County.

Planning Commission: Advises City Council in the establishment of land use, zoning, and development regulations and makes recommendations to Council in response to related requests.

Public Safety Foundation: Raises funds to provide equipment and supplies to Cayce Public Safety Department which is not available thru any other means.

Board of Zoning Appeals: Reviews zoning appeals and makes final determination as to whether appeals are denied or upheld.
