




Phase II - Guignard Park & Indigo

- Partial Road Closure on State Street
 - No thru traffic on State Street
 - Detour Route via Axtell Drive (approx. 2 weeks)
- Portions of Guignard Park closed
 - Tree Cutting
 - Headwall Excavation (approx. 15 days)
 - Headwall Installation (approx. 60 days)
 - Storm Drain Install (approx. 20 days)
- Indigo Closure- Storm Drain Installation & Restoration (approx. 130 days)



PHASE III – GUIGNARD PARK & HONEYSUCKLE STREETS





ON GOING PROJECT

CAYCE AVENUES DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Flooding along Knox Abbott Drive and in the Avenues has been a long-standing challenge. The City's commitment to mitigate these issues has brought improvements over the years, but a large-scale portion of the project is about to launch! Thanks to a \$10 million grant from the South Carolina Infrastructure Investment Program (SCIIP), construction of the Avenues Drainage Improvement Project is finally underway. This major project will take over a year to complete and may include road closures and work near private property.

Indigo Outfall Update:

The week of June 30th, there will be workers directing traffic on State Street during construction material deliveries. Please stay alert, follow all temporary traffic signs, and drive safely Effective the week of July 7th, Portions of State Street and Indigo Avenue will be closed to thru traffic, and open to local traffic only.

Naples Outfall Update:

Effective the week of July 14th the main entrance to the Cayce Riverwalk (201 Naples Avenue) will be closed for the construction of a new storm water culvert at the Riverwalk entrance road. It is anticipated that the closure will extend until late 2025, and will be reopened as soon as construction is complete and it is safe to reopen the entrance road. Alternate access points to the park are 321 Lyles Street with parking at 1908 State Street and Thomas Newman Public Boat Landing located at the end of Granby Landing Road, off Old State Rd.
